

A SPORT/SPA DESTINATION FOR ROAD CYCLING FANS



Arnoia is one of the main spa resorts in the province of Ourense and one of Europe's premier spas. In recent years, it has been associated with La Vuelta a España, both as a sponsor as well as a host for various stages.

Nestled within the O Ribeiro region, its strategic location affords it a favourable climate throughout the better part of the year. Its primary distinguishing features are the Arnoia River Canyon, the Miño River, and the thermal waters, along with its scenery. Of note are the Ribeiro monasteries, the wineries, and the Ribadavia historic complex.


Arnoia Termal Bike KmO is helping to promote and commercialize this area as a spa/sport destination, where road cycling and spa culture unite to create a new brand of tourism. There are eleven total routes, all designed and endorsed by cyclists and geared toward end users of varying levels: amateur, semi-professional and professional. The Arnoia Hotel and Spa is serving as home base for this new bicycle tourism project, and it boasts the "Bikefriendly by SERHS" certification. It offers complementary and health services to cyclists during training and recovery stages.

VILAS TERMAIS ROUTE

This route allows you to visit the Arnoia and Cortegada spas and travel through Miño River Valley, the main attraction.




CASTRO CULTURE ROUTE

The destination here is the San Cibrao de Las Castro Culture Archaeological Centre, a place of key importance to understanding Galicia.




O RIBEIRO WINE ROUTE

This route offers the opportunity to visit the O Ribeiro vineyards, one of the most interesting areas of the interior Galician.



AQUAE URENTE ROUTE

This route links Arnoia with Ourense along both banks of the Miño River and takes travellers through thermal areas.



DO PRIORATO ROUTE

This route takes you on a journey through the history that links Arnoia to the San Salvador de Celanova Monastery.



PENA CORNEIRA ROUTE

What's notable about this route is the ascent to Pena Corneira, which is distinguishable thanks to an elongated crag.

ASVILAS DO ARNOIA ROUTE

Travelling along the Arnoia River, you can visit Celanova and Allariz, which have been declared an Historic Art Grouping, and the granaries of A Merca.




DOS MONXES ROUTE

This demanding route leads cyclists to three Monasteries, these are all examples of monastic activity in Ourense.



RAIA TERMAL ROUTE

If you follow this challenging route along the border between Galicia and Portugal, you can visit places like Monçao and Ribadavia.



MIÑO-SIL ROUTE

This rigorous route passes through the city of Ourense, a European thermal point of reference, as well as Ribeira Sacra and Sil Canyon.



RIBEIRO-LABOREIRO ROUTE

A mountain route par excellance, it travels through the Biosfera Transfronteriza Gerês-Xurés, a biosphere located on the Galician/Portuguese border. A great challenge for everyone passionate for cycling.





ROUTES WITH 3D MAPS

HOTEL BALNEARIO DE ARNOIA

Arnoia boasts 89 rooms and a spa with a thermal treatment area (hydrotherapy, mesotherapy, aesthetics), as well as two therapeutic pools and a large swimming pool that has a terrace that overlooks the Miño River and Ribeiro vineyards. The hotel a high-performance entertainment centre for rowing and canoeing and is specialised in road cycling tourism: bicycle parking is available, along with a workshop and a bicycle washing/drying area, and there is an information point that offers on-road routes throughout the province of Ourense, northern Portugal, and south-eastern Pontevedra.
